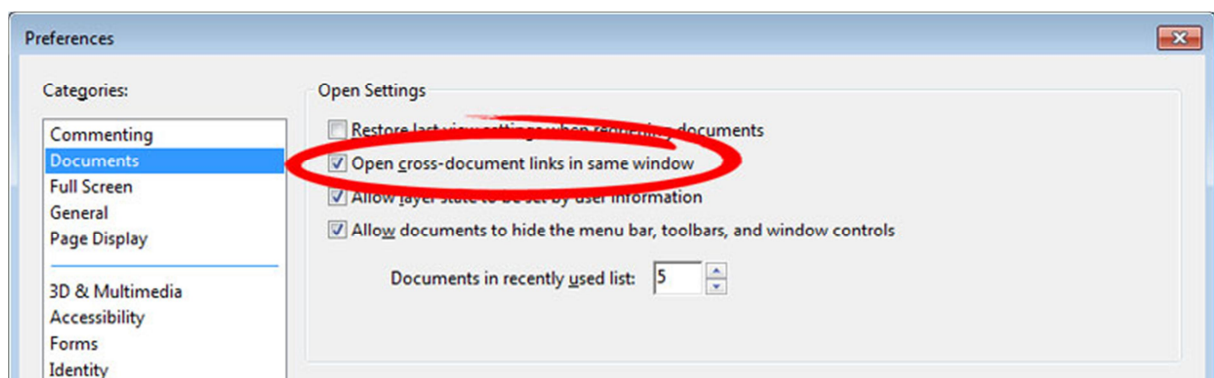


## Adobe Acrobat GUIDES (as of version 8)

### Window open, window close?

When a document with linked files has been opened and a reference link has been selected, the original document automatically closes. This is a standard setting configured by Adobe in order to prevent too many windows from being open at the same time.

In order to open a series of document links as tabs rather than separate windows, it would be convenient if the source file wouldn't **repeatedly** close. It is possible to keep a document open with the option «Open Cross-document Links In Same Window». This option is found within the drop-down menu «Edit» -> «Preferences». By deselecting the option in the «Open Settings», the original document with linked references remains open.\*

**Open Cross-document Links In Same Window** Closes the current document and opens the document being linked to in the same window, minimizing the number of windows open. If the document being linked to is already open in another window, the current document is not closed when you click a link to the open document. If you do not select this option, a new window opens each time you click a link to a different document.
